## **ROLLING HILLS PARK VILLA REQUEST**

## **FOR ENTRYWAY BEAUTIFICATION FUNDING**

The COMMUNITY SERVICES DIRECTOR reviewed the staff report dated February 20, 2001, per written material. Warner Helig, representing Rolling Hills Park Villa HOA, addressed the COMMISSION and reviewed the estimated costs for the project.

COMMISSIONER CLEWIS inquired whether landscaping improvements were annuals or perennials. Mr. Helig stated when the annuals die, the HOA will replace them. This funding would be for start up materials. COMMISSIONER CLEWIS stated she did not feel the City should pay for designer costs. She would be in favor of the City paying half the costs for repair, capping and improvement of landscaping, but not designer costs or pruning.

In answer to an inquiry, the COMMUNITY SERVICES DIRECTOR stated he has not received any more requests for entryway funding. He reiterated that ample funding is available.

There being no further discussion, COMMISSIONER FRANTZ moved, seconded by COMMISSIONER VULLO

TO APPROVE ENTRYWAY IMPROVEMENT COSTS, NOT TO EXCEED \$2,770, PROPOSED BY THE ROLLING HILLS PARK VILLA HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION.

# **APPEAL OF REQUEST TO REMOVE STREET TREES**

The COMMUNITY SERVICES DIRECTOR reviewed the staff memorandum dated February 20, 2001, per written material. He added that copies of letters received have been distributed to the COMMISSION (three against removal, one for removal of a few trees but not all seven).

Mr. Mark Anderson, representing Mario and Olga Pietrantonio, distributed a booklet to the COMMISSION showing the location of the trees and the reasons why Mr. and Mrs. Pietrantonio are requesting the trees be removed. Mr. Anderson displayed pictures of homes in the Masongate area that do not have any trees fronting the homes. He stated that approximately half of the 66 homes in Masongate have no trees fronting their home; there are 16 homes that have one large Eucalyptus tree; 8 homes have two large Eucalyptus trees; and 2 homes that have three large Eucalyptus trees. He then proceeded to read the booklet to the COMMISSION.

Terry Griggs, Co-President of Masongate HOA, addressed the COMMISSION and stated the Board welcomes Mr. Pietrantonio to the neighborhood. She added that the Board agreed a few of the trees could be removed, and the rest of the trees trimmed, but the Board was not in favor of removing all of the trees. She added the Board was against changing the character of the street.

COMMISSIONER FRANTZ inquired whether the audience would be in favor of removing two of the trees.

Ms. Georgia Davis, who lives directly behind the subject property, stated she is in favor of removing four (4) of the largest trees, reiterating the mess on the street, drippings from the trees, and the large root system were reasons for the removal.

Mr. Ron Barker, who lives next door to the subject property, stated he would be in favor of removing four of the Eucalyptus trees. He added that 4663 Sugarhill Drive is the only property disadvantaged with seven (7) Eucalyptus, and noted that the frontage at this property is smaller than any other residence.

Dr. James Hawley, who lives directly across the street from 4663 Sugarhill Drive, stated the Eucalyptus are visually pleasing to look at. He added that if four trees were to be removed, he would agree to walk with Mr. Pietrantonio and come to some agreement as to which trees would be removed.

CHAIRMAN PAGLIANO asked the audience if they would be in favor of allowing the removal of a maximum of four (4) trees. Mr. Hawley reiterated that he would like to be informed which four trees would be chosen before agreeing to the removal.

Mr. Pietrantonio stated the four largest trees have been there for a long time and the root system is immense. He added that the pictures in the booklet show the cracks in the curb and street.

COMMISSIONER CLEWIS stated if the larger trees were taken out, the little trees would grow.

COMMISSIONER VULLO complimented Mr. Anderson on the booklet and stated that when visiting the site, she noticed this house was the only one located very close to the street. In addition to the seven Eucalyptus trees and the short frontage, light does not penetrate to the house. She was in favor of removing some of the trees.

COMMISSIONER FRANTZ moved, seconded by COMMISSIONER VULLO

TO ALLOW THE REMOVAL OF UP TO FOUR (4) EUCALYPTUS TREES FRONTING 4663 SUGARHILL DRIVE; THAT THE DECISION OF WHICH FOUR TREES BE DECIDED BY THE HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVES, THE HOMEOWNER, AND ANY IMMEDIATE NEIGHBORS (DAVIS, BARKER AND HAWLEY); AND THAT THE HOMEOWNER WORK WITH THE COMMUNITY SERVICES DIRECTOR REGARDING ANY REMOVAL REQUIREMENTS..
